Ever been to a 375th birthday party? Well, Sandwich is having one! The all-volunteer Sandwich 375 Committee was formed to plan, fund, and host the yearlong 375th celebration in 2014. How can you join us in this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity? Give us a minute and we will tell you how.

For starters, here is a sampling of the major events that we are planning:

Youth Art Month in February – Showcasing Sandwich students' talent in art, music and theater.

Daffodil Festival (April 26) – Featuring a Whimsical Spring Competition, local artisans sale, Bulbs-in-Bloom sale, garden tent, "Ask a Master Gardener", music, NE Food Trucks, kids craft, and music.

Ronan Tynan Concert on April 27th – The internationally famed "Irish Tenor" will fill the SHS auditorium with his amazing voice to everyone's astonishment and joy in the First Sandwich Performing Arts Center Concert.

"Talk of the Town" 2014 Speakers Series - Eight intriguing programs on the War of 1812, the Civil War, the Canal, herb gardens, architecture, maritime rescues, American Folk Art, & Thornton Burgess.

BASH Days (Bringing Alive Sandwich History) – Four different summer days exploring the 1600s to the 1900s through period music, food, transportation, open houses, re-enactments, plays, and dances. Come see the Wampanoag summer camp and the Plimoth Militia, the Patriots vs. the Tories, 125 civil war soldiers drilling, a USO Block Party, a GEOCASHE scavenger hunt, horse & buggy rides, and more.

Heritage Day June 14th – The day starts with a March of the Descendants from the original families with church bells ringing and students singing, proclamations, student poems, and music playing. Then at SHS, an all-town photograph, picnic, cupcake competition, and the Bourne Braves CCBL game.

Heritage Hey Day June 15th – A free entry day at beautiful Heritage Museums and Gardens for Sandwich residents to explore, play old-time games, and attend a variety of concerts.

SeaFest July 26th – Enjoy an old-fashioned clambake, interesting ships from then and now, juried craft fair, shanty music, Coast Guard demo, Sandwich Throwdown, Kids Tent, re-enactors and the Hood Blimp.

Water Street Wing Fling August 2nd – Featuring hot air balloons, kids zone, kayaks on Shawme Pond, over 400 classic cars, hayrides, food garden, music, chalk & art show, and an amazing 3D Light Show.

Grand Parade September 13th – Sandwich is known for its parades, but this one will be the grandest of them all featuring many bands, floats, organizations, teams, companies, and more.

Ronan Tynan Concert April 27, 2014 Ronan Tynan - a truly remarkable man!

Ronan Tynan is truly a modern day "Renaissance Man." Ronan enjoyed singing as a boy; he did not seriously consider formal voice study until he was 33, when he was well into his residency as a physician. Born with lower limb disability that didn't sideline him, Ronan rode horses and raced motorcycles throughout his childhood. When he was twenty, his legs had to be amputated below the knee after an auto accident caused serious complications. Just weeks after the operation, he was climbing up the steps of his college dorm, and within a year, he was winning gold medals in the Paralympics as a multitalented athlete. Between 1981 and 1984, Tynan amassed eighteen gold medals and fourteen world records of which he still holds nine.

The determination instilled in Ronan by his parents soon propelled him to conquer a whole new field. Tynan became the first disabled person ever admitted to the National College of Physical Education. He later became a full-fledged medical doctor, specializing in orthopedic sports injuries, with a degree from prestigious Trinity College. At 34, Ronan won both the John McCormack Cup for Tenor Voice and the BBC talent show "Go for It" less than one year after beginning the study of voice. The following year, he won the International Operatic Singing Competition in Maumarde, France. Faced with numerous challenges throughout his life, he has persevered with enormous passion and determination.

Did you know?

- Ronan Tynan's singing offered consolation at the funeral of President Ronald Reagan.
- In the wake of 9/11, he has performed at numerous benefits and memorial services for New York's Finest and Bravest.
- Ronan Tynan has performed for countless dignitaries worldwide including many times for our Presidents and their guests at the White House.
- As a sports enthusiast, he has sung "God Bless America" at many sports events including the Belmont Stakes, Yankee Stadium, Buffalo Sabres, the Special Olympics, and at Fenway Park.
- Tynan has performed on Primetime Live, Good Morning America, and many other high-profile television shows.
- He is a member of the world renowned "Irish Tenors" and tours world-wide with them.
- Ronan is one of the most sought after motivational speakers in the U.S., presenting nearly 50 speeches annually for major international corporations and organizations.
- Ronan Tynan takes us musically where few performers fear to tread - performing across all musical genres like rock 'n roll, opera, religious, country, and, of course, his wonderful Irish ballads.
- Ronan stopped at exit 3 on Route 6 in Sandwich to try to save a man's life after his car rolled over putting his life in harm's way as the car was precariously tipped on its side.

The big Irishman has a special relationship with American audiences now. "I think Americans are fantastic people, amazing," he says. And while Tynan claims that America has given him so much more than he'll ever be able to give back, those who have attended his concerts, basking in the stirring beauty of his music and rolling with laughter at his self-effacing humor, may well just have to disagree.
